Easter was celebrated with an all-night vigil (from the Latin for “watching” or “waiting.”), because it was during these dark hours of Saturday that turned into the dawn of Sunday that Jesus rose from the dead. Also, early Christians believed that Christ’s triumphant return would occur during the Easter Vigil. No one wanted to miss Christ’s return, so all members of the faith community gathered. Whenever we come together for Mass we continue to celebrate Christ’s passion, death and resurrection until he comes in glory.
