Why Does the Date of Easter Change?

Early in church history a controversy arose about which day of the year the resurrection should be celebrated. One faction wanted it to be held on the precise historical date of Jesus' rising from the dead: the first day of the full moon that followed the spring equinox (beginning of spring). Choosing this method of setting Easter would have made it fall mostly on a weekday. The other faction insisted that Easter must be on a Sunday, because that was the day of the week that Christ rose from the dead. The Council of Nicaea in 325AD resolved the issue by deciding that Easter would be observed on the Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox. Since the time of the full moon varies, the date for our observance of Easter also changes.

"Priesthood 101"

The Whole Church is a Priestly People

Only Christ is the true priest.

Yet through our baptism, we all share in His priesthood. There are 2 ways to participate in Christ's priesthood:

- The common (or baptismal) priesthood of the faithful
- The ministerial priesthood of bishops and priests.

The ministerial priesthood is at the service of the common priesthood. Priests' lives are literally spent in service to us. The Church states that the priest's office "is in the strict sense of the term a *service*." Priests exercise their service to us in 3 ways: by teaching, divine worship, and pastoral governance. The ministerial priesthood is one way Christ builds up and leads His Church...thus every priest is a GIFT to us from God!

Did You Know?

Children Do Not Lie About Abuse

Most children are not lying when they say that they were abused. Less than 5% of all allegations are intentionally false. It is more likely that children will refuse to tell about abuse than to lie about abuse. Several studies estimate that only about 6% of all children report sexual abuse by an adult to someone who can do something about it. The other 94% do not tell anyone or talk only to a friend. (And they swear their friend to secrecy.)
