Epiphany of the Lord



In today's Solemnity of the Epiphany, Jesus is manifested as the universal Savior. Revealed to the shepherds on Christmas as Israel's long-awaited Messiah, Jesus invites all nations of the world, represented by the magi who followed the star. The prophet Isaiah's vision of the far-off nations streaming

toward Jerusalem to worship the one true God is fulfilled.

Poets and popes have seen the magi's gifts as symbolic of each disciple's gift of self. With them, we draw near to offer Jesus the gold of our adoration, the incense of our prayer and the myrrh of our hearts' devoted love.

RELATED ACTIVITIES:



*Announcement of the Paschal Dates: The Roman Missal includes the chanted Epiphany Proclamation of the Date of Easter, a medieval custom revived in our day. The proclamation takes place after the homily. In a sense, the proclamation is a consecration of the New Year.

*Signs and Symbols: Plenty of incense is used at all Masses. The figures of the magi to the nativity scene are added. The legendary names of the magi are *Gaspar, Melchior and Balthasar*.

*Other Observances: Today begins *National Migration Week*. We pray for all migrants and refugees. On Monday begins *National Vocation Awareness Week*. Let us pray for more vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life.

Dear brothers and sisters,
 the glory of the Lord has shown upon us,

 the Easter Triduum of the Lord:

seventh day of April.

Each Easter as on each Sunday the Holy Church
 makes present the great and saving deed by which
 Christ has for ever conquered sin and death.

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent,
 will occur on the

twenty-second of February.

The Ascension of the Lord will be commemorated on
 the **seventeenth day of May.**

Pentecost, the joyful conclusion of the
 season of Easter, will be celebrated on the
twenty-seventh day of May.

And this year the First Sunday of Advent will be on
 the **second day of December.**

Like-wise the pilgrim Church proclaims
 the passover of Christ in the feasts
 of the holy Mother of God,
 in the feasts of the Apostles and Saints, and in the
 commemoration of the faithful departed.

To Jesus Christ, who was, who is,
 and who is to come,

Amen.

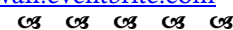
