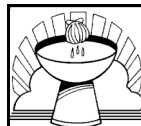

Pope Benedict XVI's Encyclical: "In Hope We Were Saved"

Pope Benedict explores the meaning of a number of Greek words in the *Letter to the Hebrews* to arrive at a better understanding of the certain hope embodied in our faith. One such word is *hypomone* (Heb 10:36). "*Hypo- mone* is normally translated as 'patience'—perseverance, constancy. Knowing how to wait, while patiently enduring trials, is necessary for the believer to be able to 'receive what is promised' (Heb 10:36). In the religious context of ancient Judaism, this word was used expressly for the expectation of God which was characteristic of Israel, for their persevering faithfulness to God on the basis of the certainty of the Covenant in a world which contradicts God. Thus the word indicates a lived hope, a life based on the certainty of hope. In the New Testament this expectation of God, this standing with God, takes on a new significance: in Christ, God has revealed himself. He has already communicated to us the 'substance' of things to come, and thus the expectation of God acquires a new certainty."

The Priesthood Today We're All in This Together

The Second Vatican Council, which convened in the early 1960s, beautifully described the role of the priest by noting three functions: "preach the Gospel and shepherd the faithful and...celebrate divine worship" (*Lumen Gentium*, 28). Interestingly, most Catholics may be most familiar with "celebrating divine worship," for example, the Mass. But the Second Vatican Council gives renewed priority to the ministry of the Word, which makes for a service-based ministry.
