#### ***The Priesthood Today—We're All in This Together***

Some years ago, Bishop Kenneth Untener, of Saginaw, Michigan, when speaking to a group of soon-to-be-ordained Jesuits, mentioned that he liked to play the piano. Then he sat down at a piano and said, "I'd like to play you a song." The bishop sang (on his own) a familiar hymn. Then he said, "Now I'd like you to sing along with me." We obliged by singing along. Then he said, "What did you think of the first version?" Wondering where this was all going, we said, "Well, it was enjoyable listening to you!" He continued, "And what did you think about the *second* version?" And we said, "Well, it was fun to participate with you and to sing along." Then the bishop said with a smile, "The first version is the priesthood *before* Vatican II; the second version is the priesthood *after* Vatican II." It was a good illustration of what happened after Vatican II: The faithful became more involved in not just the Mass but also the Church; they have a greater role; they participate more with the priest. They were certainly participating before, but now it's more overt. The same is true in our broader understanding of vocation and the "universal call to holiness" (see *Lumen Gentium*, Ch.5).
