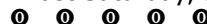

2. The Friday morning Mass at 7am and Sunday 7am Mass have been designated for collective Mass intentions in which several families may offer one (1) intention each.
3. A Mass intention for the Saturday evening Mass must be the actual death anniversary or birthday or wedding anniversary.
4. Do not put intentions in the Sunday collection. Call the parish office at 621-5109 ext. 221 to do offerings.

The Eucharist: A Foretaste of Heaven

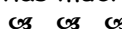
