MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

At the Easter Vigil when I light the paschal candle I say, "May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds."

Lent is meant to put us in touch with "the darkness of our hearts and minds" and open us to the light of the risen Jesus. One of the ways that happens is through the liturgy. The Lenten liturgy continually talks and sings of temptation, sin, turning from sin, being renewed. The color is purple, the color of penance and repentance, except for a bit of rose when we are more than half way to Easter.

Besides the official liturgy there are Lenten devotional practices. The one we do so well at OLS is the Friday evening Stations of the Cross. Two weeks ago our youth and young adults beautifully enriched our prayer with the living stations. Friday stations are followed by the Knights of Columbus Fish Fry, a great time of fellowship complementing the time of prayer.

The more we "get into" the prayer and liturgy of Lent the better prepared we are to sing "Alleluia" and welcome the power of Christ's resurrection. So Easter is a good time to say thank you to all who do so much to ensure that our liturgy is beautiful and worthy of the Church of Jesus Christ: Kainoa and Rani, our Liturgy Coordinators, the choirs, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, greeters, servers, MC's, the Altar Society. We are blessed by your service.

On Palm Sunday we received palms beautifully woven into crosses and other patterns. That is done each year by the Filipino Catholic Club. This year they were joined by the members of our Youth Ministry. The Youth Ministry also worked with the Knights of Columbus on the fish fry and in turn the Knights cooperated with the Youth Ministry by making props for the living stations. Such intergenerational cooperation is a sign of God's Spirit at work in our parish. Thank you to the leaders of the FCC, the K of C and our Youth Ministers for making it happen.

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

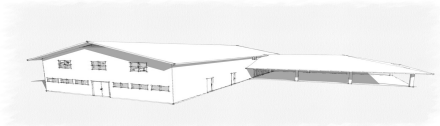

Snow, Sin and the Paschal Mystery

When I tell people I live in Hawaii, I usually hear that I am lucky to miss those snowy Midwestern winters. And while I do love Hawaii, I also miss the change of seasons. I miss multi-colored fall leaves and spring buds popping out of thawing ground. And, yes, I miss snow!

The seasons remind me that God is always creating, that God works through change, works even through chaos. Sometimes life feels like growth and sometimes it feels like death. But, God is there through it all.

Hawaii may not have dramatic seasonal changes, but we too have vivid reminders of death and new life. Idyllic northern shores in the summer bring great danger and championship “big wave” surfers in the winter. Windward rains turn to leeward desert as we cross the pali. Tsunami season comes and goes.

Life’s ongoing change is partly captured when we celebrate Jesus’ suffering, death and resurrection, what we call the Paschal Mystery. But the Paschal Mystery is more than a way to welcome spring. It is the very core of our faith. With Jesus’ resurrection, we know that sin and death itself will lose in the end. What does Jesus’ resurrection mean to you?
