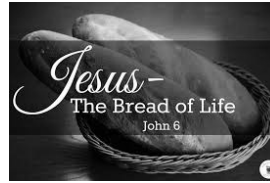

MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

We have all been given gifts by God and the best way give thanks to God is by using our gifts in service of others. When we give away our gifts we experience the joy of being generous as Jesus is generous and we find our gifts increased. Gifts are traditionally categorized under the three "T's": time, talent and treasure. This weekend we begin our annual Stewardship renewal. On the weekend of August 29-30 all of us will be asked to make an offering to the Lord of time and talent for the coming year. (Later in the year we will have a commitment Sunday for treasure.)

Time: God gives us 24 hours a day and 7 days a week. Do I give a portion of that back to him in prayer and praise? Do I give time to be with someone who is lonely or lost? Do I give the Lord time that is important to me or just time left over after accomplishing everything else?

Talents: We all have them and God gives them so that we can share them in serving others. Some talents are natural, part of how God created us (e.g. a mind for numbers) and some are the result of God's grace (e.g. the ability to console someone in distress). Let's name the gifts we have and give them back to the Lord by using them for others.

The third "t" is treasure, our financial resources. None of us are really rich but we all have some money with which to be generous by giving a percentage to the mission of our parish and to work for the poor and those in need. The spirit of Christian stewardship means deciding a percentage and giving off the top, not giving what is left after we've paid all our bills. It's a leap of faith and a sign of confidence in the Lord from whom all good things come.

Our Lady of Sorrows will be strong to the extent that we give believing that the Lord increases our blessings as we step out in faith. This weekend we continue hearing the Gospel of John, Chapter 6, Jesus' teaching on the Bread of Life. He fed well over 5,000 with five barley loaves and two fish. The boy to whom they belonged gave them to the apostles. The apostles asked "How can so little feed so many?" But at Jesus request the boy and the Apostles stepped out in faith and there were twelve baskets of left-overs. The Lord is asking us to step out in faith and give our time, talent and treasure and we will see the increase. Guaranteed!

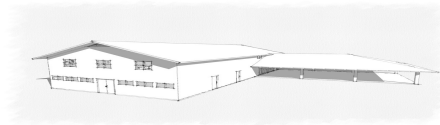
