MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

After all the Masses this weekend members of the OLS Development Committee are available on the lanai to speak with you about the Forward in Faith Campaign.

Though the parish has been speaking about building a new hall for some years, long before my arrival two years ago, some people may wonder why we need a hall. Over the next few weeks I'm going to look at some of the reasons.

Reason One: The parish community needs a place to gather.

Of course our most important gathering place is our Church. There we gather for the liturgy and sacraments. We come together to be fed by God's Holy Word and most especially by his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. In the Church we are baptized in his Holy Spirit and forgiven of our Sins in the Sacrament of Penance. The Church is where Our Lord Jesus dwells in our midst in the Blessed Sacrament. The Church is our parish's family home and it is the House of God, the Holy of Holies.

Our parish community has celebrations that are not related to liturgy or prayer. For instance last year we had a gathering of our religious education children before Christmas. They work hard to prepare a program for their parents and families. We have no place to hold such an event so we use the Church! The Church becomes a theater and the altar area, the area reserved for God's most important acts becomes a stage. Sometimes the altar is even pushed out of the way. I'm not exaggerating when I say that it pains me every time we do that but we don't have any other place for the children and families to gather. The new hall will be for our children, our youth and our adult parishioners, OLS today and tomorrow.

How much should you give to the Forward in Faith Campaign? Please pray over that decision and be as generous as you can. Remember, we have to raise \$1.5 million. Thank you in advance for whatever God leads you to give.

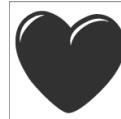
