MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Every time I celebrate a wedding, I am struck by the covenant commitment the man and woman make to one another. They vow to be together always, to be in a love relationship exclusive of all others and to cooperate with God in bringing forth children for his Kingdom. A tall order in any age!

We are all well aware of the forces in society that work against men and women being faithful to their marriage vows. However a couple is never alone. Most importantly God is with them. In the nuptial blessing, the priest prays, "Send down on them the grace of the Holy Spirit and pour your love into their hearts, that they may remain faithful in the Marriage covenant." In the liturgical celebration the couple receives the grace of the sacrament, which God continues to pour forth on them as they live their marriage.

In the homily I also include something about the community of family and friends supporting them, especially in prayer and, when needed, with words and deeds. It's not enough just to be present at a wedding, we have to support the couple along the way. As they say in Marriage Encounter, "A wedding is a day. A marriage is a lifetime."

As a parish community it would be good to find ways to support married couples and families. Some parishes have programs for couples in the early years of marriage. Others have older mentor couples that are available to accompany younger ones just starting out.

Another way of helping families grow in Christ is the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in the home. (Full disclosure- As of January 1, I'm also Director of the Enthronement for our Congregation in the USA.) When a family enthrones the Sacred Heart, they place an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a prominent place and declare that Jesus is the King and center of their home and family.
