## MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This Sunday we hear the Gospel story of Jesus driving the money changers and merchants from the Temple in Jerusalem. It's a story that is often cited to speak of Jesus' humanity. He got angry. He showed emotion, one many of us consider negative. He really is like us.

Some times when I get angry, I feel that the anger is justified, especially if directed against someone or something that is making human existence difficult or nearly impossible. For example, I don't have a lot of warm and toasty feelings toward ISIS militants who are persecuting and killing my Christian brothers and sisters. Anger at their violent repression feels just about right most of the time. However the question remains, what do I do with the anger? Do I just allow it to fester within, not doing me or anyone that much good? Can I go beyond the anger and present it to God? Can I move beyond anger and ask God to pour forth his healing balm in these seemingly impossible situations that sometimes only provoke anger in my tiny constricted heart?

Then there is another type of anger, the fiery red kind that is caused by another's unkind, unjust word or action. This is the anger that boils up within me, from where I do not know and most of the time I'm surprised it's even there. This is pure emotion. It really is not morally good or evil. It's just there before I even know it. It's best not to let it linger because I know in hindsight, in the light of God's wisdom, I'll be sorry if I let it linger and affect my attitudes towards the object of my anger and my relationship with her/him. With God's grace I can take a deep breath and move to a healthier and holier place.

The Gospel does not say Jesus was angry, I just presume so from his actions (e.g. making a whip out of chords). It does say he was zealous for the house of God. I'd say his zeal puts any anger he was experiencing in the first category of which I spoke, the justified, righteous kind.

As we journey toward Easter, I pray that the Lord give us light to know all that is going on within and in our relationships and that whatever emotions, strong or otherwise, we experience that Jesus exercise his gentle, strong and freeing Lordship over them.

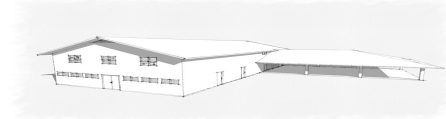
