**MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD**

All the sacraments are “Easter sacraments.” In every sacrament the risen Jesus shares with us his life, giving us his very self and changing us from the inside out. The glory of Easter is not Jesus’ alone but ours. Because the Lord lives we can live in his grace here and with him forever in heaven.

The sacraments that are traditionally celebrated at the Easter vigil are Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. These are the “Easter sacraments” in a very special sense. In Baptism we are born again through the power of the Holy Spirit. In Confirmation the Holy Spirit is poured forth upon us to strengthen us to live the Christian life and give witness to the risen Lord. While we receive Baptism and Confirmation but once, in the Eucharist Jesus feeds us with his very self all through life and unto eternal life.

During these weeks of Easter our OLS community is blessed in celebrating the Easter sacraments. On April 24 three babies will be baptized after the 9:00 Mass. On that same day during the 9:00 Mass twenty-five children will receive our Lord in the Eucharist for the first time. Then on May 7, at the 5:00 PM Mass, fourteen of our parishioners will receive the Holy Spirit’s outpouring in Confirmation. May the Lord renew the grace of the Easter sacraments in each of us and may we be good stewards of that gift.

Last week I wrote that one of the “pillars” of stewardship is hospitality. In order for people to share the gifts that God has given, our community has to welcome those gifts. This is particularly true for our young people who are receiving the Easter sacraments. They are not the Catholics of tomorrow but, with us, they are the Catholics of today! Let us welcome them as they are with their questions and their different approaches to things. Differences between generations are not an obstacle but a gift to be valued in doing God’s work as the Spirit-filled Body of Christ.

As the first Catholic missionaries, the Congregation has ministered on all of the islands and built the foundation of living and worshipping parish communities, that are in existence today. Many of the Fathers and Brothers who served in the past lack Social Security benefits and retirement funds. Fr. Richard is also a Sacred Hearts priest.
