MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Parishioners have been asking about the construction of the new parish hall, which will include ADA bathrooms accessible to the church. I'm going to try to give an update in the space I have.

Previously the plan was to build the hall in three phases. As that would have been more expensive in the long run and it would have involved us in construction for six or seven years, we have decided to build the hall all at once.

Our architects at Structural Hawaii are currently working on the schematic plans, which once approved by us, will allow them to draw the final ones, which would eventually be sent to construction companies for bids.

The architects presently estimate the cost of construction for the hall at \$1.2 million. Once the final plans are drawn that could be somewhat higher.

The parish finance committee asked that a Development Committee be organized to oversee and coordinate fundraising for the new hall and other construction (e.g. some needed work on the church).

The Development Committee has been organized. The members are Ben Acohido (Chair), Mark Yen, Glenn Brasher, Roz Pascua, Wade Higaki, Rose Layugan and Tony Espiritu. We had our first meeting on March 20 and will have our next on April 22. Before that Ben and I are interviewing four companies that might be able to help us in organizing and implementing the fundraising campaign.

The construction of the hall has been planned for a long time. It is my desire that we move forward with the approval and permit process and the fundraising campaign as soon as we can so that construction can begin. Conceivably we could begin the fundraising campaign in the fall. Once we have half the amount of the construction monies raised we can go to the diocese with our plan and ask permission to build. Then we can get to building, hopefully in 2015.

The Raising of Lazarus and RCIA's Third Scrutiny

Jesus raising Lazarus has so many juicy details that I ask each of us (incl. our RCIA candidates and catechumens!) to spend time with whatever part of the story grabbed you today.

For whatever reason, today I am struck with Jesus words right before raising Lazarus, "if you believe you will see the glory of God." We tend to think of statements like this, of belief in general, as being all or nothing statements. Believe it or not. Yes or no. A one-time choice, like how Baptism or coming into full communion with the Church is a one-time event.

But, it is not like that. As Catholic Christians, we are like Martha and Mary. We believe but we STILL must struggle to believe as we live the ups and downs of our lives. Jesus knew Lazarus would rise, yet he still wept.

For those being baptized this Easter Vigil, your life is about to be transformed. Same for you, candidates, you who soon become full Catholic Christians. Please do not fall for the deception that life will feel completely different! Like Martha and Mary, we all still ebb and flow in faith, belief, love, understanding, hope. etc... But so too do we rise like Lazarus!
