## MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

How much does God love us? Not only does he take our flesh but he stands in line with sinners to receive John's baptism of repentance. Jesus is God, perfectly holy, he had nothing of which to repent but there he is. It's the beginning of his ministry, a ministry that will end with his death on the cross. He dies to purify us and all people of sin. The absolutely sinless one gives himself for sinners.

It seems like some people are more interested in Holy Orders than in Baptism. Even the secular media will discuss who can and cannot be ordained in the Catholic church and, as for many in the Church also, their concern is mainly about who has and who does not have power.

God became one of us and did not grasp at his prerogatives as God but put it all aside for the only power that matters, love, the love expressed in his complete gift of self for us.

Baptism is a whole lot more important than being ordained. Baptism brings us into relationship with God. His Spirit fills us. We become sisters and brothers of Jesus and sisters and brothers to everyone else in his Body, the Church. And we receive the mission of bringing others to Jesus. This is the mission we share, all of us, priests and laity, women and men, young and old, absolutely all of us.

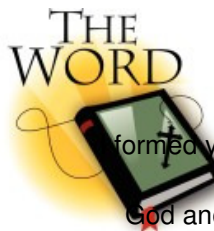
