MESSAGE FROM FR. DAVID

How are you?

We have had a few interesting people come to the rectory door for one thing or another. One lady was interested in having me chase away an evil spirit from her daughter. I guess she thought I was an exorcist. I informed her that I am not, and gave her the number to call at the diocesan offices.

Two people, at separate times, came to pick up an item that was being sold. On the ticket it said that there would be someone there until 12 Noon to ensure that pick up could occur. The first person came at 11:15 am, and the second at 11:30 am. But no one was there to help these folks. I took their names down, and passed them on to the person in charge. Just a word that it is important for each and every one of us to honor public commitments that we have made.

There was also a young woman, in the military, who was looking for the accomplishment of First Penance, First Eucharist and Confirmation, and the official notifications that go with these sacraments, so that she could be the godparent for baptism on the mainland, next March. Now, with the RCIA, that is almost feasible. But she is due to be deployed to Asia soon, for three months. That wipes that out! The office manager and I passed on the idea that perhaps the Catholic chaplain could work some sort of positive result. Also we raised the idea of being the Christian Witness at the celebration.

Just a note that baptism is an important sacrament. Please tell your family members that this is not just a social event, like another reason to party. There needs to be much preparation for the sacrament. Parents are called on publicly to state that they will be the most responsible teachers of the Catholic faith.

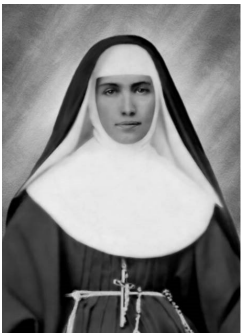
