MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Today is the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord, traditionally known as Corpus Christi.

One of my favorite liturgical texts is called the "Sacrum Convivium" from the first two words in Latin "O sacred banquet." It goes like this, "O sacred banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of his Passion is renewed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory to us is given. Alleluia."

The Mass is a "sacred banquet", a banquet partaken not at a table but at an altar. An altar is where a sacrifice takes place. Mass is the sacrifice of Christ on the cross renewed in our midst sacramentally. "The memory of his passion is renewed." "Memory" for Jews meant not just of remembering the past but remembering in a deep spiritual way that rendered present once more the power of the event being remembered. We remember Christ's passion and death and the grace of that event fills us now.

"Christ is received." Jesus gives himself for us on the cross. He gives himself to us in the Mass. We receive not just bread and wine but Jesus Christ, as we learned in catechism "body and blood, soul and divinity." We receive his body and blood. It is really him. He is present "soul (humanity) and divinity." We receive the whole Christ. Because of that we are "filled with grace." He is the gift of gift. There is no greater grace than to receive him and to let him fill our hearts and minds.

"A pledge of future glory is given to us." The Eucharistic banquet in which we partake of Jesus Christ is but a pledge of the eternal banquet that the Lord promises us in heaven.

Celebrating Mass is the most important thing that we do as a parish. Celebrating the Mass is the most important thing I do for you as your pastor. The Eucharist is the gift of gifts because it is Jesus. Alleluia.

Eastertime is over, yet the Church offers us another whole month of major celebrations. I think in part the Church offers these "post-Easter" feasts to try to help us connect the dots. Our faith is meant to be one whole picture, a seamless garment. Our faith does not end with the Resurrection or even with Pentecost. Rather, they point us towards the rest of our lives. And today we celebrate that which especially helps us to follow Jesus every day we live.

This is why the Body and Blood of Jesus is so important for Catholics. We are "saved" when we are baptized. We become God's children. But, how do we live that out every single day when we are still burdened by life's difficulties and by our own weaknesses?

Through the Eucharist.

Our only real chance of actually following Jesus, of loving enemies, of turning away from our tendency towards sin, is through the Eucharist. Every day, Jesus becomes nourishment for us, for our very souls. Jesus draws us close by letting us consume him. We consume him and then, ironically, we become more "Him" through this consumption.
