MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The first reading for today's Mass from the Acts of the Apostles tells about how the young church responded to the needs of its members. Some of the widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution (probably of food and other material goods). So the twelve Apostles instituted a new ministry to serve the widows. As things often happen, the seven men appointed eventually broaden their ministry to include preaching God's Word.

Though the word is not used, the Church has traditionally seen in this passage the institution of the order of deacon. Every seminarian serves six months to a year as a deacon before being ordained to the priesthood. There are other men who are called exclusively and permanently to be deacons. Here at OLS we are blessed with the ministry of Deacon Ben Awana and Deacon Dino Emwalu, who are Permanent Deacons.

The Catechism tells us "Among other tasks, it is the task of deacons to assist the bishop and priests in the celebration of the divine mysteries, above all the Eucharist, in the distribution of Holy Communion, in assisting at and blessing marriages, in the proclamation of the Gospel and preaching, in presiding over funerals, and in dedicating themselves to the various ministries of charity." (CCC 1570)

Who can be a Deacon? The Permanent Diaconate is open to all baptized Catholic males, married or unmarried, who will reach the minimum age of 35 at the time of ordination. As you can imagine, formation for the diaconate takes some years of personal, spiritual and intellectual formation.

If you are interested, I'm sure Deacon Ben or Deacon Dino would be happy to share with you what it's like being a deacon. If you'd want, please contact me and we could talk or you might want to call the diocesan director of deacon formation, Deacon John Coughlin, at 808-203-6729.

Easter Season Activities for Families

Praying the Rosary

The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the *Apostles' Creed*, which summarizes the great mysteries of the Catholic faith. The *Our Father*, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the *Hail Mary* is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary. St. Pius V officially added the second part of the *Hail Mary*. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life. There are four sets of Mysteries: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and—added by Pope John Paul II in 2002—the Luminous.

The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead one into restful and contemplative prayer related to each Mystery. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells. The Rosary can be said privately or with a group.

United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

How to Pray the Rosary:

1. Make the Sign of the Cross.
 2. Holding the Crucifix, say the *Apostles' Creed*.
 3. On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.
 4. Say three *Hail Marys* on each of the next three beads.
 5. Say the *Glory Be*.
 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery, then say the *Our Father*.
 7. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten *Hail Marys* while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a *Glory Be*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.")
- After saying the five decades, say the "Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:
- V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. *Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.*
