## MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It's said that there are 613 commandments in the Old Testament. Naturally anyone wanting to seriously live Old Testament faith would wonder if some were more important than others. This was a hot topic at the time of Jesus and so the scholar of the law in the Gospel asks Jesus "Teacher which commandment of the law is the greatest?" Jesus responds with the commandment to love God with our whole being and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

It seems easier to remember just these two commandments than the 10 given to Moses. Some people think them more "positive" than a list of do's and don'ts. But then "love" can mean almost anything. Someone could convince him/herself that they were "loving" while committing adultery, for example. Sometimes these words of Jesus are quoted as a way of watering down our faith in Jesus and the commitment that it entails.

However Jesus' teaching on love is very demanding. We are to love God with our whole being. At the last supper he told us "Love one another as I have loved you." How much has he loved us? He gives himself completely for us, dying on the cross to save us. He teaches us, "Love your neighbor as yourself." We can't just take care of ourselves and our needs. Jesus asks us to love our neighbor. What does that look like? Think of the parable of the Good Samaritan!

Because God loves us, he blesses us with gifts. We live because of him. We live eternally because he has saved us. We each have natural talents. His Holy Spirit blesses us with gifts of prayer, teaching and service. Some gifts of the Spirit are asleep within us and we ask that the Holy Spirit enliven gifts that we are unaware of. All these gifts are signs of God's great love for us as individuals and as a parish. We love God by sharing these gifts with our "neighbor" with our brothers and sisters here at OLS. We are stewards of God's gift and sharing those gifts is good stewardship. When we give God's gifts, we fulfill the greatest commandment and we experience the blessing of the Lord.
