DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Is the Bible’s table of contents part of the inspired text? Did the Bible fall from heaven preprinted and bound in a single volume? Does the Bible anywhere tell us which books belong in it?
2. How do we know which books are inspired and authoritative (and thus deserve to be included in the canon of the Bible)? Why is this an important question?
3. Luther held that a book belonged in the canon if it taught salvation by faith alone. Calvin said that the only way to know a book is inspired is by the internal witness of the Holy Spirit. Using standards like Luther’s and Calvin’s, what would prevent someone from rejecting huge portions of the Bible and rewriting the canon any way he liked?
4. Why did the Catholic Church chain Bibles in churches?
5. Why did the Catholic Church keep the Bible in Latin for so many years?
6. Why did the Catholic Church burn certain Bibles?
7. Why did the Catholic Church sometimes prohibit reading certain versions of the Bible?
