THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Weekend of April 18-19, 2015



“He was made known to them in the breaking of bread.”

This weekend's gospel begins with the conclusion of the famous story about the two disciples who meet the Risen Lord on the road to Emmaus:

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. (Luke 24:35)

The two disciples encountered the Risen Lord in such a profound and unexpected way. As He spoke to them, their hearts were burning as Jesus opened the scriptures to them, and they didn't realize it was him until He broke bread with them. We can see a relation to the two major parts of the Mass in this simple scene: Word and Eucharist.

When we come to Mass, what is our expectation? How do we determine if it was a “good” Mass or not? Is it the preaching, the music, or the people? If we use the story of these two disciples as a method of evaluation, it was nothing that anyone did that contributed to their experience. It wasn't about dynamic preaching or inspiring music. It wasn't even about having a great welcoming committee. Rather, they were touched by Jesus himself who was made known in the Word and in the breaking of bread.

Does that excuse boring preaching, horrible music, and unwelcoming parishioners? Not at all. But the lesson should be that despite all those things, at every single Mass, Christ is made truly present in the Scripture and in the Eucharist. We have the opportunity to encounter the Risen Lord every time we step into the church. He is everything we need. So instead of expecting to get something out of it, how are you opening yourselves up to receive everything out of it?

On a side note, don't be an unwelcoming parishioner. Extend a nice gesture to a stranger today...it could be contagious.

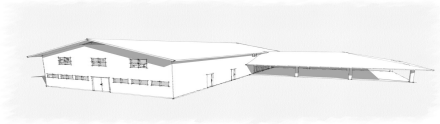

On the other hand, when I sit and reflect, the inadequacies of my life quickly become apparent. Then the Resurrection starts to make more sense. True, my life is very blessed. But, it is also really hard. Let's face it: it is downright painful to be human. And, honestly, there is hardly a day that goes by where I do not experience this pain firsthand.

The Resurrection obviously did not end suffering. The Resurrection does, however, tell us that Jesus transforms it. Christ makes good come from pain, ushers forth new life from inadequacy. As a Christian, I believe Christ is with me in my suffering and is working to bring forth new life. Whether I am thinking about the Resurrection or not.
