### MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

This weekend we welcome Sister Malia Dominica Wong, a Dominican Sister, who will speak to us of the great gift of the consecrated life. After many years of living the consecrated life in the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts, I am ever more deeply aware of the Lord's gift in calling me to be a religious. The gift is not for me but for the Church. It's really only my gift if I give it away.

All the baptized have received gifts from God. Our Diocesan Stewardship Effort is entitled "Malama I Ka Makana – Cherish the gift." Receiving God's gift with appreciation is the basis of stewardship. 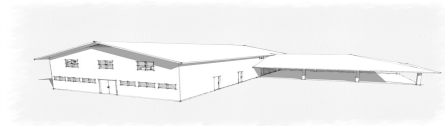

## Word, Sacrament and Attending Other Churches

Normally, this Gospel is referenced as one of the key differences between Catholics and our Protestant siblings. This chapter from John's Gospel is a large part of why we believe that Jesus literally gives us his Body and Blood, transforming us more into himself every time we partake of Eucharist. "I am the bread of life." John 6:35

While in no way denigrating the amazingly precious, awesome gift of Eucharist, we nonetheless need to keep another important tidbit in mind. Our faith is based on Word and Sacrament. And not just Eucharist, but all seven Sacraments. Too often we denigrate the Bible, the Word of God, as something lesser than Eucharist. This is an error on our part.

We can remember this when our loved ones (or we ourselves!) attend a nondenominational or other Protestant church service. Jesus is the bread of life who feeds us in Sacrament. But Jesus is the bread of life who also feeds us through his Word.

If you have Catholic friends or family attending non-Catholic churches, respond to them in loving openness. Be Christ for them – be Eucharist for them. You can even consider breaking open the Word together. Share some of your favorite stories about Jesus!
