MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This Wednesday we begin once again our Lenten journey to Easter. In his message for Lent 2015, Pope Francis calls our attention to the problem of indifference. We are indifferent when we withdraw into ourselves, care mainly for our own comfort and forget God and the faces of the poor and suffering in which we see Christ.

Our Holy Father writes, "Dear brothers and sisters, how greatly I desire that all those places where the Church is present, especially our parishes and our communities, may become islands of mercy in the midst of the sea of indifference!"

Pope Francis tells us that the antidote to indifference is mercy. God always offers mercy. His mercy is incarnate in Jesus, whose death and resurrection we prepare to celebrate. Mercy connects us with God and with those who need our love. Mercy does not leave us indifferent and unconcerned for the lost, the sinners and the poor.

The three Lenten "disciplines" (within that word we find "disciple") are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The purpose of our prayer is to open us to God's mercy, which stretches our hearts to see others with mercy. Fasting means giving up something we dearly like to make room for God and the need of others. Almsgiving is diverting our resources from ourselves to the work of God, especially care for his poor. Prayer, fasting and almsgiving all mean change and even conversion. If we live them sincerely during Lent we may not be the same come Easter. Hopefully my indifference will give way to mercy. Pray for me. Let us pray for each other.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CORNER

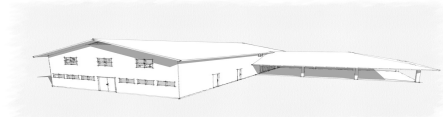

New Parish Hall & OLS Capital Campaign

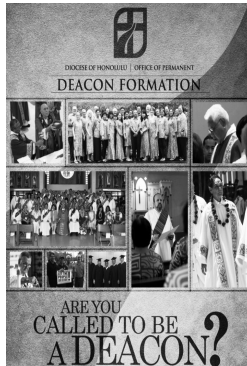
