MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

The Gospel this weekend tells of Jesus sending the twelve out two by two. They have heard his teaching and witnessed his mighty deeds. Now it is time to go out. Jesus did not call them to form a tight knit little circle around him but so that they would go out and so he calls us. If Wahiawa is going to know the Lord Jesus, we can't sit around waiting for the Lord to do some astounding miracle. He has already done the miracle in us, giving us his Holy Spirit, and he's counting on us to go when and where he sends us.

Saint Paul in the letter to the Ephesians tells us "the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ...has filled us with every spiritual blessing in the heavens." This is the sufficient grace he spoke of last week. We have every blessing we need but if we hoard the Lord's blessing and not share it, we are not the Church but just a shell of a church. We would be like those Russian Easter eggs, very beautiful on the outside but nothing much inside, good for a museum shelf but not much use for feeding those who hunger for the Lord.

We are stewards of what Saint Paul calls, "the word of truth, the gospel of salvation'. We are redeemed by his blood, our sins are forgiven and he has "lavished upon us" "the riches of his grace" so that we can share that treasure as good stewards.

This week I read a story of Christians in Pakistan, good stewards of the Gospel. "Each year a team of evangelists in Pakistan attends Islamic religious festivals in order to share God's Word with people who regularly read the Quran. They distribute Bibles even as fanatical leaders preach jihad nearby. During these events, it's not uncommon for a worker to give a copy of the New Testament to an Islamic spiritual leader or to exchange phone numbers with a youth so that they can follow up on a discussion about Jesus. These bold evangelists are more concerned about sharing God's Word than about the potential for a violent reaction."

Our Pakistani brothers and sisters can be an inspiration for us. Here, where God has planted us, he is calling us to step out as stewards of his mysteries, sharing Jesus with those who hunger and by sharing, giving God thanks.

Surprisingly, most of us are actually quite like the disciples who took nothing for the journey. How? Because most of us feel completely unprepared to talk about Jesus, to talk about our Catholic faith. We are "naked" and feel like we have nothing to offer, nothing to say to people we encounter in life.

Rather than tell you to grab your Bible and start memorizing passages, I want to encourage you to pray to be like the disciples. Pray to be more open and willing to talk with others about Jesus. Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus will speak through you to heal and cure others of their deepest ailments. I know this sounds sappy and idealistic, but my faith tells me to ask you to try.
