MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Pope Francis has declared this a Year of Consecrated Life. It began last November 29, the First Sunday of Advent, and will conclude on February 2 next year. During this year the Holy Father wants us to become more aware of consecrated life as a gift to the Church. Next weekend we will be visited by a team from the diocesan vocation office. They will give a short talk after communion and will have a display after Mass on the lanai.

Someone said to me a few weeks ago that it was great that the Holy Father called for a year of consecrated life but she didn't understand what the term "consecrated life" meant. I'm sure that is true for a lot of folks, so let me try to explain.

To be consecrated is to be made holy, to be set apart by God. We are all consecrated in Baptism. That consecration is deepened in Confirmation and we renew that consecration in every Mass as we are fed with Jesus' Body and Blood.

Some Catholics are called by the Lord to make the living of that baptismal consecration the complete focus of their lives. So they enter a religious community and profess to live forever in celibate chastity, poverty and obedience.

Their religious consecration is a consecration within their baptismal consecration, a particular way of living baptism.

Seven years before I was ordained to the priesthood, I made those three vows as a member of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts. That was 47 years ago and through all the ups and downs of life, Jesus is always calling me to give more of myself to him and his Kingdom. I was consecrated when I professed my vows and the Lord asks me to always deepen that consecration so that I can be more his.

There are many communities of consecrated life- Benedictines, Franciscans, Dominicans, Marianists, Carmelites etc. My religious family, the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts was founded in France in 1800 to live the consecrated life (vows) with a spirituality focused on the love of Jesus and Mary and adoration of the Eucharist and to serve the Church in a variety of apostolic works. Missionaries of our community brought the Catholic faith to Hawaii in 1827. Saint Damien lived the consecrated life as a brother of our congregation. Next Saturday, August 1, two young men will make their first vows as ss.cc. brothers at St. Patrick's Kaimuki. The story continues.



Episode 9: "The Life of His Love: Prayer and the Life of the Spirit"
