MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Friday of this past week was the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Saturday was the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These are the two principle feasts of my religious family, the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts.

How often in the course of my life I've been introduced as a "Sacred Heart Father" and under my breath I sometimes add "ts". It may sound like a technicality but the symbol of our community says it all. It's not just the Heart of Jesus or the Heart of Mary or to two of them next to one another but the two hearts are entwined. Jesus is the Son of Mary and Mary is the mother of Jesus, the incarnate Son of God. Their love flows back and forth and always out in abundance on us their children.

All through the gospel Jesus reveals himself as love and mercy. There is no limit to what he desires to do for us, to heal us, to lift us up, to share his life and mission with us. His heart is burning with love for us. The effect of his love in our lives and in our world is only limited by our sin and our refusal to repent and seek his grace.

At the moment of his supreme sacrifice on the cross, he says to the "Beloved Disciple", who represents all of us who are the beloved of Jesus, "Behold your Mother." Mary shows up very little in the Gospels but every time she is present it is significant. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus says "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act upon it." (Lk. 8:21) Then in the first two chapters, the story of Jesus birth and childhood, Luke portrays Mary as the one "who hears the word of God and acts upon it." To the call to be the mother of God, she responds, "May it be done to me according to your word." Mary is the woman of the pure heart, full of grace and completely given to Jesus and the coming of God's Kingdom. She is our mother, who leads us only and always to her Son, Jesus.

Jesus points us to our Mother and our Mother leads us to her Son, our Brother. We can never go wrong in a relationship with Jesus and Mary!

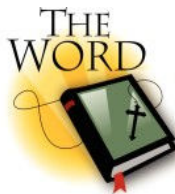
Father's Day Book of Remembrance

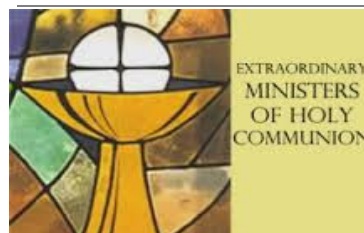

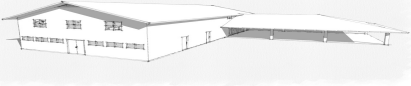

The Mustard Seed and Fewer People at Mass

Many Catholic Christians today hurt over the diminished number of people attending Mass. This seems contrary to today's readings, growth out of control. Where is God in all this?

My full-time job for the diocese, the Catholic Church, is to empower people to grow in their faith. But, here's the rub. What if the Holy Spirit leads someone to worship with a different faith community AND if by doing so, that person grows closer to God, becomes more loving and flourishes as a human being?

Honestly, in this situation, we have genuine cause to celebrate. I personally may be sad they are not sitting with me at Mass. However, our faith calls us to help people know and follow Jesus Christ. We know this happens most fully within a faith community. That said, our Gospel today also suggests that we do not get to control when the grain is ready for harvest. We do not control where the mustard seed grows.
