MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD


The Gospel this week is about the storm on the lake and Jesus asleep in the boat. Commentators say that the first Christians to hear this Gospel were the members of Mark's community at Rome who were suffering through the persecution of the Emperor Nero. Their brothers and sisters in Christ were being arrested and killed. The sea was certainly stormy. In fact the Gospel describes the storm as "a violent squall"... "waves were breaking over the boat" and the boat was quickly taking on water and beginning to sink. Those Christians in Rome must have thought that the Church was sinking and that the Lord was asleep on the job.

Jesus says to the frightened disciples in the boat, to the Christians at Rome and to us today, "Do you not yet have faith?" At times my faith can be as shaky as anyone's. I believe. I have faith but it's not as deep as it should be. I tend to be overwhelmed by the storm sometimes raging around me. The storm, which like any storm is a temporary affair, blinds and deafens me to Jesus, the eternal Son of God. I have faith but it is not yet deep enough.

As for the disciples in the boat and that community of Saint Mark's at Rome, we do not lack challenges to our faith. St. Peter, the first Bishop of Rome, writes, "Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for [someone] to devour. Resist him, steadfast in faith, knowing that your fellow believers throughout the world undergo the same sufferings." (1 Pt. 5:8-9) The devil is prowling about looking to do us in and so our needed response is not fright but steadfast faith. God has not left us and He is infinitely stronger than the prowling devil. The Lord works within us and through our brothers and sisters (even the ones we find difficult) to deepen our faith.

In 1903, Fr. Felice Capello, a great Jesuit spiritual director, wrote to a person experiencing trials, "I sense that the Lord is asking a lot from your heart. I sense that good Jesus wants to detach you from everything and everyone; that he wants to draw you closer to himself...that he wants to lead you...to an intimate union with him, by the means of difficulties..." Even in the storms of life, and perhaps particularly there, the Lord is leading us to deeper faith in Him.




