MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

The two healings in this weekend's Gospel are the final miracles in a series that show Jesus power over nature, evil spirits and here over sickness and even death.

Hearing the Good News we are not just to reflect upon a past event but upon the power of Jesus risen in us. Where has Jesus' been powerful in my life? Where has he changed me? How has he helped me overcome evil? If I don't have an answer to questions like that, it's not that Jesus is not present but I'm not seeing with eyes of faith.

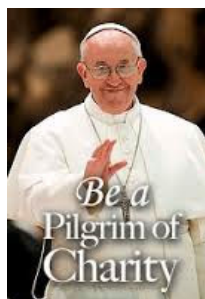
One of my favorite lines from the Psalms is "The LORD's mercy is from age to age..." (Ps. 103:17) God's love and mercy are infinite and they touch each of us every day. As truly as the Lord heals the woman with the hemorrhage and raises the daughter of Jairus, he pours his mercy on me where I most need it (not where I think I most need it.)

How do I give thanks? As a priest, I render thanks when I celebrate Mass and pray the Divine Office, the Church's praise spread out over the day. "Seven times a day I praise you because your judgments are righteous." (Psalm 119:164) We can all sprinkle our day with short prayers of thanks.

Saint Paul alludes to another way of giving God thanks. In 2 Corinthians 8 he's making a collection for the needy Christians at Jerusalem. He tries to arouse the generosity of the Corinthian Christians by citing all that the Macedonians gave in spite of their poverty. Both rich and poor are to take as their inspiration Jesus, who became poor for us, so that by his poverty we could become rich. (2 Cor. 8:9)

Everything we have, including our financial resources, is from God. Our faith challenges us to recognize that. We are the stewards of God's gifts. When we accept that in faith, we find joy in giving and our giving becomes our thanks to God.

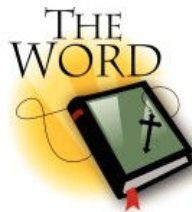
