**MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD**

The Gospel for today's feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord tells us once more of Jesus's last supper with his disciples.

Jesus sends two of the disciples before him and the rest. They go into Jerusalem where "they prepared the Passover." The Passover, the yearly feast of the Lord freeing the Jewish people from slavery, had to be prepared. They could not just arrive and immediately begin. Things had to be readied, the material things for the meal but also the hearts and minds of the disciples. And this was not just another Passover. From now on the Passover of the Lord would be Eucharist, the celebration of Jesus sacrifice on the cross for the salvation of the world.

If the disciples "prepared the Passover," we can ask ourselves, how do I prepare the Eucharist? Before Mass I try to be as quiet and recollected as possible but it's not always easy. If I seem to be distracted at the beginning of Mass (e.g. I forgot the Gloria at one Mass on Pentecost!) it's probably because my attention has been scattered in the sacristy just before Mass. If my mind is filled with sights and sounds and chatter right up to the moment when Mass begins, I'm not going to be all that well prepared.

So some suggestions for right before Mass: (these are for me as much as for anyone else!)

- \* Don't wait for the commentator to ask everyone to turn off "electrical devices". Forget the cell phone. Whatever is on there is not as important as who (i.e. Jesus) is in Church.
- \* Turn off the conversation. Sometime there is something important to say, but idle chatter, just connecting with friends and passing the time of day...well, it's not as important as speaking to the one who is present and to speak with HIM we need silence.
- \* Read the Scripture for the day. It's in the Breaking Bread in each pew. In the bulletin we list the readings for the coming Sunday so that we can read them even before coming to Church.

"They prepared the Passover". Yet the Passover is the figure, the Mass is the reality. The Passover is a remembrance of the Lord freeing the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. The Mass is not a remembrance of what Jesus did but it is Jesus saving sacrifice present among us sacramentally. He is present. It's really HIM. He is present in the tabernacle waiting for our love and adoration and desiring to give us his love, mercy and wisdom.

A danger for us priests is to become so familiar with Mass that we forget its power and importance. Please pray for me that I'll always be aware of the mystery that I celebrate and let us all prepare well.

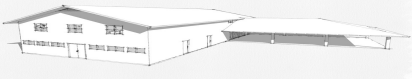
