MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Recently we were talking about our use of incense in our liturgy here at OLS. We don't do it every day or even every Sunday but just on major feasts. In the Easter season there are multiple occasions when we incense because the Easter season, which we conclude this Sunday on Pentecost, is the time when we celebrate the central mysteries of our Catholic Faith.

The sweet smelling smoke rising to God reminds us of the sacrifice of the Jesus, offering himself to his Father on the cross and on our altar. We incense holy objects, things/persons consecrated to the Lord. One of the most impressive uses of incense is at a funeral. We incense the body of the deceased, the body of a Christian, consecrated in baptism to be a temple of the Holy Spirit.

We lift our hearts in prayer and praise as incense rising to God. There is the beautiful line from Psalm 141, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering." Whenever we pray our hearts rise to God.

On Pentecost we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We received the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation and He is poured forth on us every day. Jesus is with us because his Spirit dwells in us as in a temple. Every once in a while, someone asks me, "Father can I just pray and talk to God from my heart or do I need to say prayers?" There are many ways to pray. Prayer is never just my effort but the breath of the Holy Spirit in me. The Spirit will enable anyone who desires to open their heart to God. He helps us offer our love, our doubts, our questions, our plans...our everything to God, like the incense that rises from our altar.

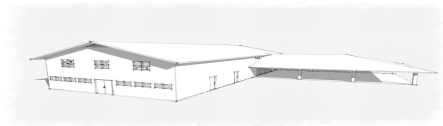
