MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

October is Respect Life Month and the theme for 2015 is "Every life is worth living." Respecting life means safeguarding the sacredness of human life at all stages of its development and in the many different challenges life presents.

Respecting life means being opposed to the murder of the unborn through abortion but it also requires that we help women and men dealing with difficult pregnancies and that we offer healing and reconciliation to women who have had an abortion.

Every life matters, even the lives of the elderly and infirm. So we approach the end-of-life issues from our Catholic faith and we oppose the move to euthanasia and physician assisted suicide.

Science can do many things. Most are good but some are questionable from a Catholic moral perspective. It's not enough to say that science can do something, the moral question is "Should it be done?" Because life matters we raise questions about medical procedures that do not respect life.

In his address to congress Pope Francis called for the abolition of the death penalty. He spoke of the hope for change for even the most hardened criminals. Lives matter even the lives of those who are guilty of heinous crimes.

It seems a week cannot go by that we do not hear of a shooting in a school or on a college campus. After each one there are calls for new gun control measures. They may be needed. However I always wonder if there is not something deeper. Some of the very leaders who wring their hands over gun violence are the same ones who consistently support of a supposed "right" to kill the unborn. Until we really believe that "every life is worth living", violence will plague our society.

Every life is worth living! Every life matters because every human life comes from God and is sacred.

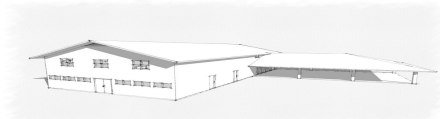

New Parish Hall & OLS Capital Campaign

Thanks to all our Parishioners who are participating by pledging to the *Forward in Faith* campaign. Our pledges of \$805,861 toward our \$1.5 million goal has given our Parish the opportunity to move forward and obtain the loan, finalize contractor and architect plans, negotiate a project manager, and anticipate demolition and construction start in the first half of 2016.

In the mid-1980s, a move to Wahiawa gave us the opportunity to attend Mass at Our Lady of Sorrows Church for the first time. It was quite the enjoyable experience, the open-air ambiance, the music, a bell-tower, school and pre-school. Most of all, the friendly and community feel of the Parishioners.

In the beginning, I sometimes wondered where this "Parish Hall" was whenever it was mentioned. As I drove through the parking lot every Sunday, it took a while to realize that what I thought was a "storage shed" was in fact, our Parish Hall. Over time, we've seen the bell tower disappear, both pre-school and school close, the existing Parish Hall work its best to keep functioning, the Church electrical and sound system in need of upgrade, and of course, our restrooms, which have seen the test of time.

Along with many people working "behind the scenes," our *Forward in Faith* campaign needs all of your support. If you have not already, please consider making a pledge to our Church. Back in June, you may have heard one of our Youth speak for the campaign: Tessa, Jayce, and Wai. They all spoke of this amazing opportunity, not only for future generations, but for all of us.
