MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

When Pope Francis was visiting the USA, a number of commentators have remarked how they could not figure him out. They tried plugging him into a liberal-conservative, Democrat-Republican hole and he just did not fit. Is that because of some quirky outlook on life particular to Pope Francis or is simply because he is Catholic and the universal pastor of the Catholic Church?

Before the President, the Holy Father spoke approvingly of what the administration is doing on climate change and he also reminded Mr. Obama of the importance of religious liberty, which the president, as many others, often confuses with the freedom to worship. After the canonization of Father Junipero Serra, Pope Francis made a visit to the Little Sisters of the Poor, whom the administration is trying to force to pay for contraception and abortion coverage in violation of their religious liberty.

In his historical address to both houses of Congress, the Holy Father called for openness to the immigrants who still come to our shores and care for our common home, the earth. He also spoke of cherishing human life at all stages of development and the importance of the men and women forming families. As one of the CNN reporters said, he was applauded twenty times, some applause came from the Republican side of the aisle and some from the Democrat.

Human life is from God. It is sacred from the first moment of conception. It is still holy and good when weakened by age and sickness. It is that basic belief that we hold as Catholics. That belief is the basis of involvement of many Catholics to craft policies that respect the life of the unborn, the poor, the immigrant, the imprisoned, the sick and the aged. As the Holy Father said in his address to congress, we believe in this truth but we also must seek practical solutions in dialogue with other persons and groups in our society.

October is Respect Life Month. The theme this year is "Every life is worth living." All lives matter. This is bedrock Catholic teaching. It's not about being left or right, Democrat or Republican. It's Catholic, universal, reaching out to embrace all God's people.

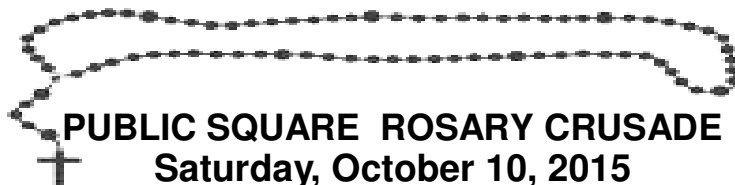

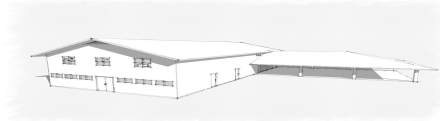

Back in February, our Forward in Faith Campaign kicked off on an ambitious, yet achievable goal to raise \$1.5 million for new restrooms, a Parish Hall, and much needed upgrades to the Church. Thanks to 391 of our fellow Parishioners, Families, and Businesses, we have raised \$805,861 in pledges and funds.

Recently, Fr. Richard has both spoken and written about the progress of all of our efforts. With the amount pledged and funds on hand, our Finance Committee has submitted the application for the loan. Preliminary feedback is positive.
