MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I want to bring you up to date with two developments in our parish.

The School Building: As I told you some months ago, the Kamalani Academy, a Charter School that wanted to open in Wahiawa had approached the parish and the Diocese of Honolulu about leasing our school building. You may have read in the Star Bulletin about a week ago that the Kamalani Academy received approval from the State of Hawaii Charter School Commission. This means that in August 2017 our school will begin to be used for the kindergarten to eighth grade charter school. During this academic year the group opening the school will be doing work on the building to ready it for next year's opening of classes. At present the diocesan lawyers are drawing up the lease agreement that the parish, diocese and charter school will sign.

This means changes for the parish. For example, our religious education classes and youth ministry will meet in the parish office building and eventually in the new hall when it is completed. Leasing the school building will be a source of income for the parish. Among other things it will allow the parish to develop ministries and community outreach that we cannot do now for lack of funds.

The new hall and bathrooms: There has finally been some movement in the permit process for the new hall. All the comments have now been received and can be addressed with the different city agencies. Last week Guia Lasquette, our Project Manager, and Max Velasco, Chair of our Building Committee, met with representatives of Structural Builders, our construction firm. This week or next Guia and Structural Builders will schedule face to face meetings with the relevant city offices to address outstanding issues.

Renovation of the Cathedral Basilica Of Our Lady of Peace Collection: August 20-21, 2016

The Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace is the mother church of the Diocese of Honolulu and serves as a spiritual center for downtown Honolulu.

This historic building, dedicated in 1843, is the oldest cathedral in continuous use in the United States. It was home to Father Damien De Veuster — later Saint Damien — who served our community for more than two decades, and Mother Marianne Cope — later Saint Marianne — who worshipped at the Cathedral upon her arrival in Hawaii. A relic of Saint Damien — a foot bone — and the mortal remains of Saint Marianne are enshrined in the Cathedral Basilica.



Restoring the historic Cathedral Basilica will preserve our community's spiritual home for another century and beyond. Mahalo for your generosity.

Living Catholic in the 808 Listening As Evangelization

Last week, I suggested that if someone struggles with some aspect of the Catholic faith (like, for example, devotion to Mary), that our first action should be that of listening. Our American culture places little value on listening. Reality TV depicts people lying and tricking one another. Debate is a high school club and a scholarship opportunity for college. Heck, we don't even want to vote because we sense that our politicians don't listen.

Listening may not be very American, but it IS very Christian. Listening affirms the dignity of the other. Listening breaks barriers - there is no longer separation, only unity. Listening builds up the one, true Body of Christ, whether the “other” is Christian or not!

When it comes to evangelizing, many Catholics feel uncomfortable, unprepared to speak. But, what if I was to tell you that our faith teaches us that we cannot convert hearts and minds by anything we say, by any eloquent speech, by winning an argument?

Of course, there is a time and place for words. (Absolutely there is!) But, evangelization is first and foremost about helping someone encounter God, to experience and know Jesus. Being heard, being listened to, is one of the most privileged ways people encounter Christ.
