MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Next Sunday Bishop Larry will be with us to celebrate our seventy-fifth anniversary as a parish. Eighty-six years ago OLS was established as a mission of St. Michael's, Waialua. In 1928 the old wooden church of Immaculate Conception, Ewa, was moved on a trailer over winding roads to become the spiritual home of Our Lady of Sorrows mission. It was placed on property at the corner of California Ave. and Lehua Ave where the First Hawaiian Bank is today.

The presence of the Catholic Church in Wahiawa for the last 86 years means that the Mass has been celebrated and Jesus Christ has been sacramentally present in Wahiawa. There is no Church without the Eucharist. The Vatican Council called the Eucharist "the source and the summit of the Christian life." Pope John Paul said, "The Church draws her life from the Eucharist."

We may think that Catholic worship is basically the same as what happens in many non-Catholic churches with some additions. There are readings and a sermon and then we Catholics add on communion. At times the homily is not well done or obscure in its message and some go away saying that they "got nothing out of the Mass" or "they were not fed." They may even go to a non-Catholic Church where the preaching is better, or at least more stimulating, but where Jesus in the Eucharist is totally lacking. However well intentioned that may be, they have not grasped what the Eucharist is.

The Catholic Mass is fundamentally different than a Protestant service centered solely on the Scripture. In Holy Mass the offertory, consecration and Holy Communion are not mere add-ons to the liturgy of the Word. The Scriptural Word and the homily prepare for and lead to the sacramental celebration of Jesus sacrifice on the Cross, which happens on our altar. The highpoint of the Mass is the reception of Holy Communion, when we become one with the Lord who gives himself for us and is our life. The bread and wine consecrated by the priest truly becomes the body and blood of Christ, who says to us, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." (Jn 6:53)

After Holy Communion we place the Eucharist that remains in the tabernacle so that we can take Our Lord to the sick and the dying. We also reserve the Eucharist because it is the Lord, who desires to be in our midst, his heart open to us whenever we want to come to speak to him of our cares and joys.

God's holy people have been here on California Ave. for 86 years. The Church where we gather, the old wooden one down the street or our present one, is a holy place. Jesus is here!




