MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As you will read elsewhere in the bulletin, our parish youth have formed a praise and worship group called Rekindle. I saw them sing and dance at the Central Oahu Vicariate Youth Day last month. They are outstanding. On Friday, the 28th, at 7:30 PM they will offer praise and worship here in our church. Let's all make an effort to join them. What a great way to spend an evening, praising the Lord with our young people.

As Catholics we should be good at praising the Lord. It's what we do at every Mass. The Greek word that "Eucharist" comes from means giving thanks and praise. The greatest act of praise was Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. He gave himself entirely in love for his Father. At Mass we join in Jesus' love and praise and through the Spirit we offer ourselves with Jesus to the Father. Because of that, the Mass is the greatest prayer that we could ever imagine. It is the prayer of Jesus.

At times we may think that Mass is really about us. We speak of "getting something out of Mass." However it's really the other way around. At Mass Jesus gives himself in love to the Father and to us. We give ourselves with him and as we give ourselves, he gives himself to us in Holy Communion. We only receive because first we give.

It may also seem that the Mass is a dialogue between the priest and the congregation. Mass is a dialogue but not between the priest and people but between the Church, the Body of Christ, (priest and people together) and the Father. The priest does have a specific role. He sacramentally represents Jesus as head of the Body. He pronounces the words of Jesus, "This is my body...This is the chalice of my blood..." The priest must disappear behind those words as servant of Jesus Christ and servant of his Body.

And it's all the absolutely greatest act of praise and worship, the praise and worship of Jesus.

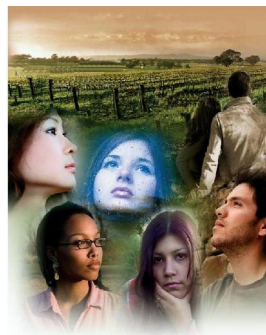
