MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Every five years or so Bishop Larry visits each parish in the diocese to assess how things are going, what strengths can be built on and what weaknesses need to be addressed. Bishop's visit to OLS will take place on the weekend of August 27 and 28. After the 5:00 PM Mass on Saturday he will meet with the parish leaders. On Sunday morning after the 9:00 AM Mass Bishop Larry will hold a town hall to which all parishioners are invited. After that he will meet with parish youth and young adults over lunch. At all three meetings he will ask two basic questions, "What are the blessings of our parish?" and "What are the hopes and dreams of our parish?"

As the basis for his visit, Bishop Larry will use our OLS Parish Pastoral Plan, which sets out goals and objectives to implement our parish mission statement. In 2014 the Pastoral Council accepted the present pastoral plan and has been working on its implementation since then. In doing so, it became clear that the plan needed to be updated, especially in view of Bishop Larry's visit. The first step in revising the plan is to get input from parishioners.

This weekend at all the Masses we are asking everyone, young, old and in between, to fill out a simple questionnaire that will be an important contribution in updating our OLS Pastoral Plan. I will walk us through the questionnaire after the homily.

Hungering for a Healthy Start

The next stop on our CRS Rice Bowl journey is the African nation of Rwanda, where we're reminded to care for the unborn. This week we pray for pregnant mothers, that they may have the medical and nutritional support they need to raise healthy, thriving children.

Odette's story

Odette's daughter Olga could have easily become one of the many children in Rwanda who don't receive the nutrients they need to develop and grow.



But Odette started working with Catholic Relief Services even before she gave birth to ensure her child would get the care she needed during the crucial first 1,000 days of life. The nutrition a child receives from the time he or she is in the womb until his or her second birthday can mean the difference between a promising future and one of poor health and limited opportunities.

Catholic Relief Services is working with communities in Rwanda to end child malnutrition by supporting health and nutrition programs, and teaching families to grow crops that add nutritious variety to their meals.

Because poverty is a major cause of malnutrition, CRS helps families find opportunities to earn an income. With a loan from her microfinance group, Odette started a business selling agricultural fertilizer so she could support her family.

Odette attends weekly classes that are helping her grow healthy crops on her farm. She's also taking courses on how to prepare nutritious meals from those crops. And she takes Olga to regular well-baby visits to measure her weight and growth, and ensure she is healthy.

This year, Olga will reach a milestone: Her second birthday. Because Odette has been feeding her a variety of nutritious foods-many of which were grown in the family garden-Olga is growing up strong.
