MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

A Mercy Thought....

In his book, *The Name of God is Mercy*, Pope Francis says “Mercy is the divine attitude that embraces. It is God giving himself to us, accepting us and bowing to forgive. Jesus said he came not for those who were good but for sinners. He did not come for the healthy, who do not need a doctor, but for the sick.”

We don’t have to get it all together so the Lord will love us. He loves us because we are lost and don’t have it all together. He comes looking for us and when he finds us, if we give him just the smallest opening, he’ll do wonders in us and through us. He looks for us over and over. Our Lord is infinitely patient with his wandering sheep.

After I finished reading Pope Francis I began to reread *Jesus King of Love*, written in 1920 by Fr. Mateo, one of our Sacred Hearts Fathers. He writes of God’s mercy using some of the same expressions that Pope Francis does in 2016. Mercy is not something just for this Jubilee Year of Mercy, it’s the heart and soul of our Catholic faith. It is in 2016. It was in 1916. It will be in 2116.

If mercy is so essential to faith, I ask myself, how do I live mercy? On some days it’s closely related to patience, just being patient with the shortcomings of others that annoy me as I hope with God’s grace they will also be patient with me. Thanks to so many of you for your merciful patience with me, your pastor.

- Visit the cemetery and pray for those you have lost.
- Spend time planning your own funeral mass, read through the Order of Christian Funerals and find our hope in the Resurrection.

GIVE ALMS TO THE POOR.
