**MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The most important thing we do as a parish is celebrate Holy Mass. Last Monday in his daily homily Pope Francis spoke beautifully of our Catholic faith in the Eucharist. He said, "to pray at home, to pray in Church, to pray the Rosary, to pray so many beautiful prayers, is one thing, but the Eucharistic celebration is something else." The Eucharist is not one prayer among others. There is no comparison between Mass and all the other prayers we can pray as Catholics, as good as they might be. The Mass is the prayer of prayers because it is the prayer of Jesus.

The Holy Father reminded us that Mass is not just a social act, a time to get together or a prayer meeting. It is something wholly other. At Mass he said "the Lord is made present on the altar to be offered to the Father for the salvation of the world." The Mass is not a religious service but a sacrifice, the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. It is Jesus greatest act of love and his highest praise of his Father. In his homily Pope Francis distinguished between religious symbols that remind us of Jesus, such as a nativity scene or Stations to the Cross and the Mass. At Mass "God approaches and is with us, and we participate in the mystery of the Redemption." The Eucharist is not just a symbol that reminds us of a past event but Jesus saving sacrifice on the cross made sacramentally present here and now. At Mass we participate in the sacrifice of the cross just as surely as the Blessed Mother and Saint John did. As Pope Francis said, "it is the Last Supper itself...it is to really live once more the Passion and the redeeming Death of the Lord."

We celebrate Mass at an "altar", not just a "table". Sacrifice needs an altar. The one who presides is a "priest", because a sacrifice needs a priest. The altar is a symbol of Christ, the one offered, and so we kiss it. Christ is the one priest and any man only shares in Jesus' priesthood through grace.

The Eucharist is not something we create. It is a mystery bigger than me and bigger than this community. Only by faith can we participate in the great mystery.

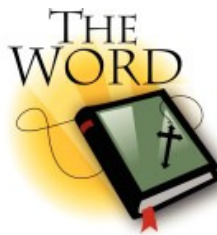

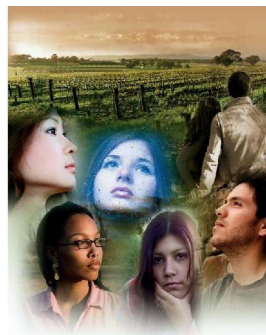
