MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I just read of another school shooting, this time in Roswell, NM. That followed the shooting in a movie theater in Florida. Inevitably the talk shows on CNN and FOX will once more debate gun control. However I wonder, as necessary as they may be, about the limited reach of gun control measures. Does gun control really address the deeper issue of violence in our society?

Next Saturday, January 25, is the March for Life at the State Capital. The march is held every year toward the end of January to commemorate the Roe vs. Wade decision of the US Supreme Court of January 22, 1973 which opened the way for almost unlimited access to abortion in our country. Unborn children, among the weakest and most defenseless of human beings, no longer have a right to life.

Proponents of free access to abortion speak of a "right to choose". However the question is not really choice but what is being chosen. When society accepts the choice to violently eliminate the unborn child, can we really be surprised that society as a whole becomes increasingly violent and coarsened? However it is not just about going to a march once a year or shouting slogans of the pro-life movement now and then. If we are going to be authentically pro-life, we have to be committed to supporting the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death. That goes for us as individuals and as a parish community.

May God show us new ways to do that in this year 2014.

At every Mass, we hear these words from today's Gospel, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." The Baptist was pointing to the human (and yet divine) body of Jesus who happened to be walking towards him at that moment in time.

However, the Body of Christ, the Lamb of God, is not just the human who walked the earth. All three ways we understand the Body of Christ most assuredly take away our sins.

This partly explains Catholics emphasis on Eucharist. Receiving Communion, the Body of Christ, literally wipes clean our venial/minor sins and strengthens us to not commit serious/mortal sin. Eucharist, the Body of Christ, takes away the sins of the world.

And since you and I are members who make up the Body of Christ, the People of God, we collectively become the Lamb of God, taking away the sins of the world. As we heard in today's Gospel, Jesus baptized us with the Holy Spirit. Now we, the Body of Christ, we also work to take away the sins of the world.
