MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the second reading for today's Mass, St. Paul writes to the Corinthians, "I urge you, brothers and sisters...that there be no divisions among you but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose." The followers of Jesus Christ through the centuries have not always lived up to Paul's urging. All the different churches along California Ave. are witness to that.

We have just concluded the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. It is a time to remember something we all too easily forget: the Lord desires his body to be united. At the last supper, the first Eucharist, Jesus prayed for those who would believe in Him over the centuries, "that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me."

Even though we are divided into different churches and communities, we share belief in Jesus, the Son of God, who wants us to be as united among ourselves as he and the Father and the Spirit are. That's a tall order but it's His desire, His prayer and ultimately His work.

I experience the unity that already exists among the followers of Jesus, each time I participate in the monthly meeting of the Wahiawa Ministers' Association. There are doctrinal divisions among us and they cannot be overlooked as they have to do with God's revealed truth. However unity in a common faith in Jesus Christ places our differences in proper perspective.

Army to Study Potential Biofuel-capable Power Plant on Schofield

The Army invites the public to provide input on the scope of a future Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the construction and operation of a 50-megawatt biofuel-capable power generation plant, here. The Schofield Generating Station Project (SGSP) would be a source of renewable power that would benefit the Hawaiian Electric Company ("Hawaiian Electric") and Oahu residents by supplying power to the island-wide grid during normal operations.

Interested members of the public are invited to participate in the scoping process by helping to identify possible alternatives, potential environmental impacts, and key issues of concern to be analyzed in the EIS. During the 45-day scoping period, which runs Jan. 17 to March 3, the community can participate in public scoping meetings; submit written comments; or both. The scoping meetings will be held the first week of February, as follows:
