MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Two words that we hear often in the Gospels are "apostles" and "disciples". "Apostles" is used in Matthew, Mark and Luke but never in John. It always refers to the group, sometimes called "the twelve" or "the twelve apostles." "Disciple" is used in the singular in all four Gospels but only a relatively few times. The plural "disciples" is used many more times. In Mark, the shortest Gospel, it appears almost 60 times. Why do I say this?

First, I think it's clear that though the Gospels do mention names of apostles or disciples, those individuals are worthy of mention because they are part of the community. The disciples are the community of the followers of Jesus Christ. Disciples become apostles when the Lord sends them out to do his work, preaching the kingdom of God, healing the sick and casting out demons.

The Gospel this weekend uses neither word for "the seventy-two". Obviously they are part of a larger group that has been following Jesus. Are they all journeying with him as he goes to Jerusalem or are they folks living along the route who have made a commitment to live according to Jesus' way? Whatever, they are clearly followers, i.e. disciples. They have turned from a former way of life and have embraced the Lord and his Good News. Now Jesus sends them on his mission. The word "apostle" means someone who is sent. Those sent return to Jesus having witnessed the power of God working through them.

Disciples become apostles. That's always the way. As Jesus' followers we are given God's gifts, which are nurtured in the community of our fellow disciples. When we have the courage to step out, using those gifts and sharing our faith we see the power of God at work. Disciples are meant to become apostles. Disciples who stay stuck in discipleship and never step out never release the power of God in themselves or others. Let us pray for our OLS community that we love Jesus so deeply that we will have the zeal to bring him to others.

Welcome, Fr. Ajith, as you begin to share the journey with OLS!

Second Collection on July 9-10, 2016


