MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Only a very solemn and important feast bumps the Sunday celebration and this is one of those feasts, the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Why is it so important? Probably because without Peter, the rock on which Jesus built his Church and Paul, the apostle to the gentiles, we would not be here. The church might have remained a little Jewish sect, perhaps still existing in a few outposts in Israel and Palestine.

In the Acts of the Apostles we hear how Paul preached the Gospel to “the ends of the earth.” He was on fire with the word of salvation in Jesus Christ. He went all over the world calling people to faith and establishing communities of believers, who in their turn preached the Gospel of salvation. He taught that the Church is a living, breathing organism – the Spirit-filled Body of Christ. Every member is anointed with the Spirit of God. Each brother/sister has spiritual gifts to be used in the service of Jesus’ Gospel.

St. Peter is always named first in the lists of the Apostles. He clearly has a pre-eminent role in the Church as seen in the four Gospels, Paul’s letters and the Acts of the Apostles. As we hear in today’s Gospel, Jesus calls him the “rock” on whom he will build his Church. In Peter’s successors, Jesus gives his Spirit-filled Body, Spirit-filled Shepherds to insure that we remain His Body, living by the truth of His Gospel. They are a rock, a sure footing for the Church through the ages.

It can be tempting to prefer Paul to Peter or Peter to Paul. In other words, we could think of the church as Spirit-filled and lively and downplay or ignore the need for structure and leadership. Or we could get all caught up in structure, laws and policies and forget the movement of the Spirit. As someone said, the spirit of Catholicism is not “either/or” but “both/and”. We are both the Spirit-filled Body of Christ called to evangelize the world and a Church graced with leaders, who insure that it is really the Gospel of Jesus that we believe and proclaim. We Catholics are the Church of Peter and Paul.

On another note...I will be away for vacation and retreat during the month of July. July 1-2, Fr. Dedi Riberu will be taking my place. Fr. David Lupo will be holding down the fort the rest of the month and one weekend Fr. Pat Fanning will fill in. Thanks be to God for my ss.cc. brothers who are happy to fill in here at OLS!
