**MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I've been reading a novel by one of my favorite authors, Evelyn Waugh. It's entitled *A Handful of Dust*. It's the story of the English comfortable class in the early 1930's. They have so much materially but it all comes to nothing, just a handful of dust.

On Wednesday we'll be marked with ashes as a sign of repentance. The priest or deacon can say, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." It's a pretty sobering thought. In today's Gospel Jesus says to us, "Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear..." Don't worry about all that because it all comes to dust anyway. He goes on, "Can anyone of you by worrying add a single moment to your life span?" Worrying is normal but, in the end, futile. The Lord calls us to grow beyond consuming concern for what ultimately is a handful of dust.

Sin consists in preferring what is really dust to the gold that is life in Jesus Christ. The devil tempts us with what seems beautiful and good (fools' gold) and then when we fall, he mocks our foolishness. Yet God is always waiting to raise us up and pour forth on us his healing mercy.

During Lent we journey to the Easter Triduum and the celebration of our redemption. Jesus says, "Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all..." (Clothing, shelter, food, drink companionship etc.) Try to put worry about them aside and "seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness..." At Easter we celebrate that God has given us what is most important for life here and in eternity. He's given us himself and in him we receive all those things about which we worry so much.

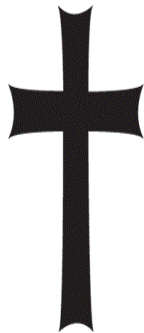
