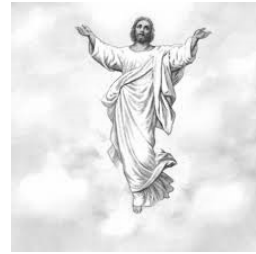

MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A Spirituality of the Ascension

If we are honest with ourselves, I don't think many of us are actually happy that Jesus ascended into heaven – wouldn't we much rather walk and talk with him like those from 2000 years ago? Given this, I suppose it is not surprising that today's feast day is pretty "ho-hum" for most of us.

But, it should not be that way. We have cause for rejoicing.

As today's Gospel predicted, we are now "clothed with power from on high." Jesus told us he must leave to send the Holy Spirit. This means that wherever we walk, whoever we talk with, Jesus does so with us, thanks to him ascending into heaven and sending us the Holy Spirit.

There's also a spirituality of Ascension that we experience at various points in our lives. Ascension marks the period of time after death, when we feel new life taking root, and yet, YET, we really can't see what that new life looks like. We are not yet experiencing the fullness of our changed, different life. This spirituality contains the conviction that things are going to turn out okay, even though we don't know exactly what life will look like.
