MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We interrupt the flow of "Sundays in Ordinary Time" this week and next. November 2 is the feast of All Souls. Yesterday, November 1, was the Feast of All Saints. The two feasts speak to the meaning of life and the final destiny of us who are followers of Jesus. They begin the new month of November and we just finished October, which is Respect Human Life Month. All Saints and All Souls answer the question, when all is said and done, what is the meaning of my one human life?

As Christians we deeply believe that each human being is a unique unrepeatable person, made up of body, soul and spirit. I'm not just a soul temporarily using a specific body. I'm a unique combination of body, soul and spirit, a person. There's never been one like me and there'll never be another me. God makes us each unique. So belief in reincarnation, that my soul can inhabit different bodies in different lifetimes, is unchristian, a denial of God's creation.

All Saints Day, November 1, reminds us that our ultimate goal is to spend eternity in heaven with God. This is what our Father wants for each of us. Some outstanding disciples of Jesus are declared "Saints" by the Church but we are all called to be saints. Because God wants that for me, he will give me every help and grace throughout life to help me to get there. That's what we call "providence".

On All Souls Day, November 2, we pray for our deceased brothers and sisters. Many of us come to the point of death and, while we desire to be with the Lord forever, we're not quiet saints, not completely ready to enter God's Kingdom. There are small sins and the residue of bigger sins still clinging to us and we need to be purified of that before we see God face to face. Somehow God in his great mercy does purify us. It's the experience we call "purgatory". On November 2 and during the whole month of November we pray for the departed that God will purify them and take them to himself in heaven.

The older I get the shorter life seems. Have I even begun to make a "bucket list"? It may be better just to cherish as well as I can the gifts God is giving and the surprises that continue to happen. Appreciating them I can return them to the Giver with thanks. That's not a bad start for eternity, where we'll thanks and praise God forever.

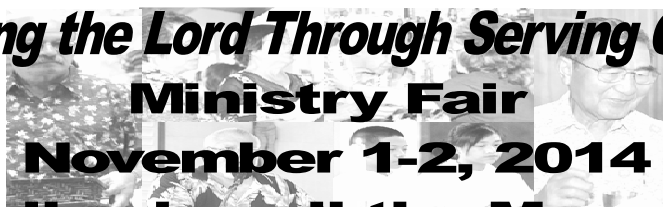
