MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As you know two weeks ago I was in Orlando for the International Catholic Stewardship Conference. Bishop Larry is calling all the parishes of the diocese to adopt Stewardship. As he told the priests at our convocation last May, "This is not an option." With that in mind the diocese sent twenty-two of us to the conference. Travel etc. was paid by a grant from the With Grateful Hearts Campaign.

It was a whirlwind trip, or so it seemed to this seasoned traveler but who is now not as young as he used to be! We arrived in Orlando on Saturday evening and were back on the plane for home early Wednesday morning. I have to say that the jet lag and disruption was well worth it.

The first talk I attended was one of the best. It was on "the spirituality of stewardship." The speaker was a pastor from Wichita, whose parish adopted stewardship some years ago. He made the point that stewardship cannot just be another plan or program. If that's all it is, it will be a lot of work (which stewardship is anyway) but it will fail. Thanksgiving for all God's gifts and sharing them sacrificially in love of God and neighbor has to become the hallmark of our lives as individuals and as parishes.

One of the things I prayed about during the conference and since then are the gifts that God has given me to pastor OLS. How good a steward am I? Do I trust that God gives me the gifts of His Spirit that I need? Do I step out in faith using them for the community? One of the temptations of a pastor is to simply administer the organization and not really shepherd God's people as God wants.

Another talk I went to was about organizing a parish stewardship council or committee. That is the group that oversees stewardship efforts and makes sure that they are a ongoing characteristic of parish life. Bishop Larry has given us December 31 as a target to put together a Stewardship Committee.

We'll learn about stewardship together. May God bless us with increase as we share His gifts.
